BACKGROUND TO THE PLAN, FALL 2017





ALBERTA OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE ASSOCIATION

- AOHVA represents All-Terrain Vehicle (ATV), Off-Road Motorcycle (ORM) and Side by Side (UTV) groups or organizations that are registered as non-profit Societies or Associations.
- Our organization is comprised of a diverse group of people who care for and love the landscape.
 - Membership includes 20+ clubs from across Alberta
 - Approximately 165,000 users of off-highway vehicles
 - OHVs are the central focus of recreational activities enjoyed by over 500, 000 Albertans

WHAT WE DO

- AOHVA is dedicated to providing safe motorized recreational activities in an environmentally responsible manner.
- In addition to advocacy, our efforts focus on education, safety, and the restoration of trails and associated facilities on public land throughout Alberta.
 - Deliver Education and Safety Programs
 - Promote Respectful, Responsible and Courteous Riding
 - Support Environmental Stewardship
 - Advocate for continued OHV use across Alberta, provincially and locally

LAND USE FRAMEWORK

- The Government of Alberta is currently working to develop and implement a province-wide Land Use Framework, enacting the biggest change to land use in the province in 30 years.
- People from across the province (from cities and small communities) travel to southwest Alberta to enjoy outdoor recreation activities.
- Hundreds of thousands of Albertans will be impacted by the decisions now under consideration.
 - Castle Park Management Plan
 - Southwest Alberta Recreation Management Plan
- Alberta businesses will be significantly impacted as well.

ISSUES

- Minister Shannon Phillips is CLOSING the Castle Parks to all OHV and open camping activity.
- Minister Shannon Phillips is expected to announce SIGNIFICANT reductions to OHV trails and open camping spots in Porcupine Hills and Livingstone – as early as the fall of 2017.
- Minister Shannon Phillips is expected to announce SIGNIFICANT reductions to OHV trails and open camping spots across the Eastern Slopes – as early as the spring of 2018.

An estimated loss of over 2,200 km of OHV trails in southwest Alberta is expected to be announced by the government this fall.

- Common Goals:
 - To ensure that as many trails as possible remain open to all Albertans
 - To close illegal trails and trails that threaten environmentally sensitive areas
 - To place greater emphasis on enforcement
- AOHVA has repeatedly informed the provincial government of our interest:
 - To rapidly develop the framework for a user-funded, sustainable, environmentally responsible trail network
 - To create a trail network that acts as a significant economic driver

- Rather than simply install gates all across the Alberta landscape, we propose working with our government to build a trail management legacy that all Albertans can be proud of.
